


<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>As part of our Light topic, we will be looking at reflection and how this helps a periscope work. Use the resources on the Y6 class pages on the website and create your own periscope at home.</p>	<p><u>History ***</u></p> <p>We would like you to find out about how the war impacted Aylesbury (and the surrounding areas) and its residents. How you choose to present your research is up to you. You could use the information you found out at Waddesdon Manor to help, or there are links to other information on the school website. Alternatively, you could research your family during the war.</p>	<p><u>History</u></p> <p>During the war, materials such as fabric had to be rationed to ensure there was enough to go round. People therefore had to reuse what they had rather than buying new (a bit like upcycling today). This was known as ‘Make do and Mend’. Your challenge is to create a new item from old ones – there are some suggestions on the homework page if you’re stuck.
