- Open door policy!



### **HOME LEARNING**

#### \*Maths

Let's re-cap the number bonds to 10 using the part, part, whole model. Choose any number to 10 and record all the different ways to make that number.

Can you record them in order?

0 + 6 = 6.1 + 5 = 6

Challenge: Can you use and apply your number bonds to greater numbers.

Eq 3 + 6 = 9 so 13 + 6 = 19 and 23 + 6 = 29



This week we would like you to be a book worm! How many books can you read in a week? Here are some suggested book related activities. You may also think of some of your own.

Choose your favourite book and read it aloud to someone. Read with expression. Try to memorise parts of the story to re-tell aloud. From your chosen book, write down all of the red words. Stick them up around your home. Design a new character for a favourite book or re-write the ending.

This half term the children will be preparing for their transition to year 2. Think about and write some questions that you would like to ask your new Year 2 teacher. What do you want to know? What do you want to find out? Remember to start your sentences with a capital letter and end them with a question mark.
